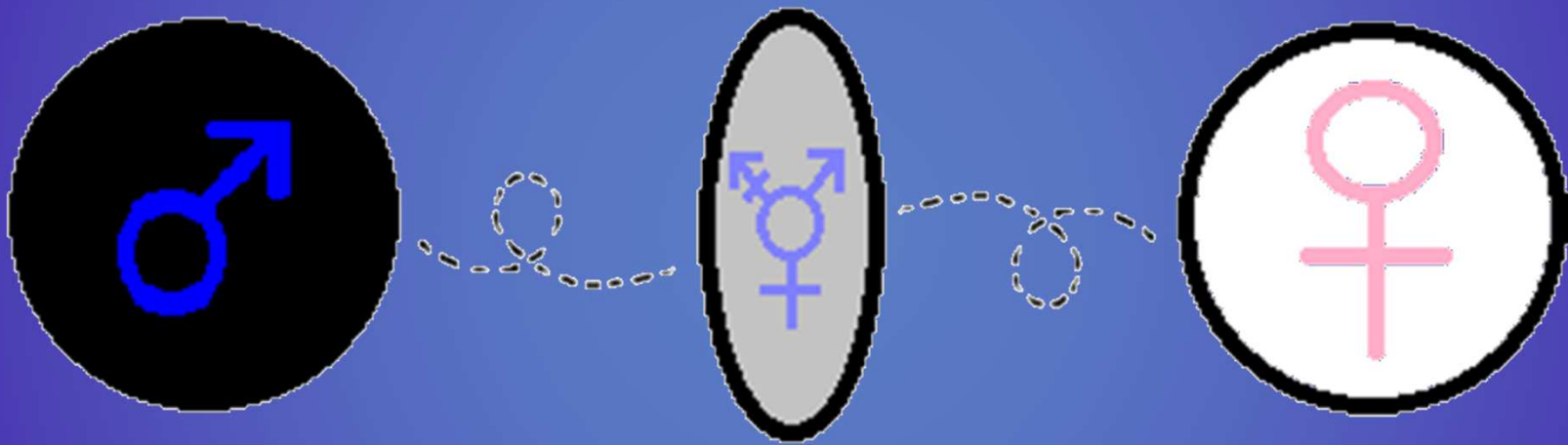

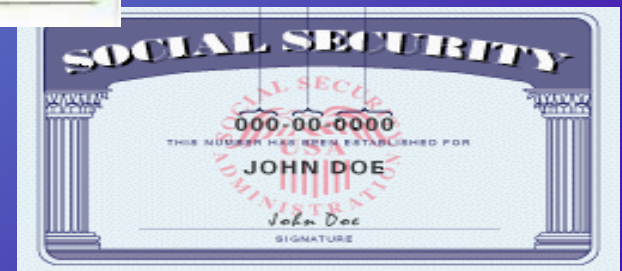

Creating an Inclusive Definition: Three Principles of Sex

I) Sex is the assignment or classification of people based on physical characteristics.

II) Accurate assignment of an individual to a sex must be based on several overlapping continuums rather than binary categories.

III) An individual's location on these continuums may not be constant, thus one person may have multiple sexes.

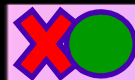

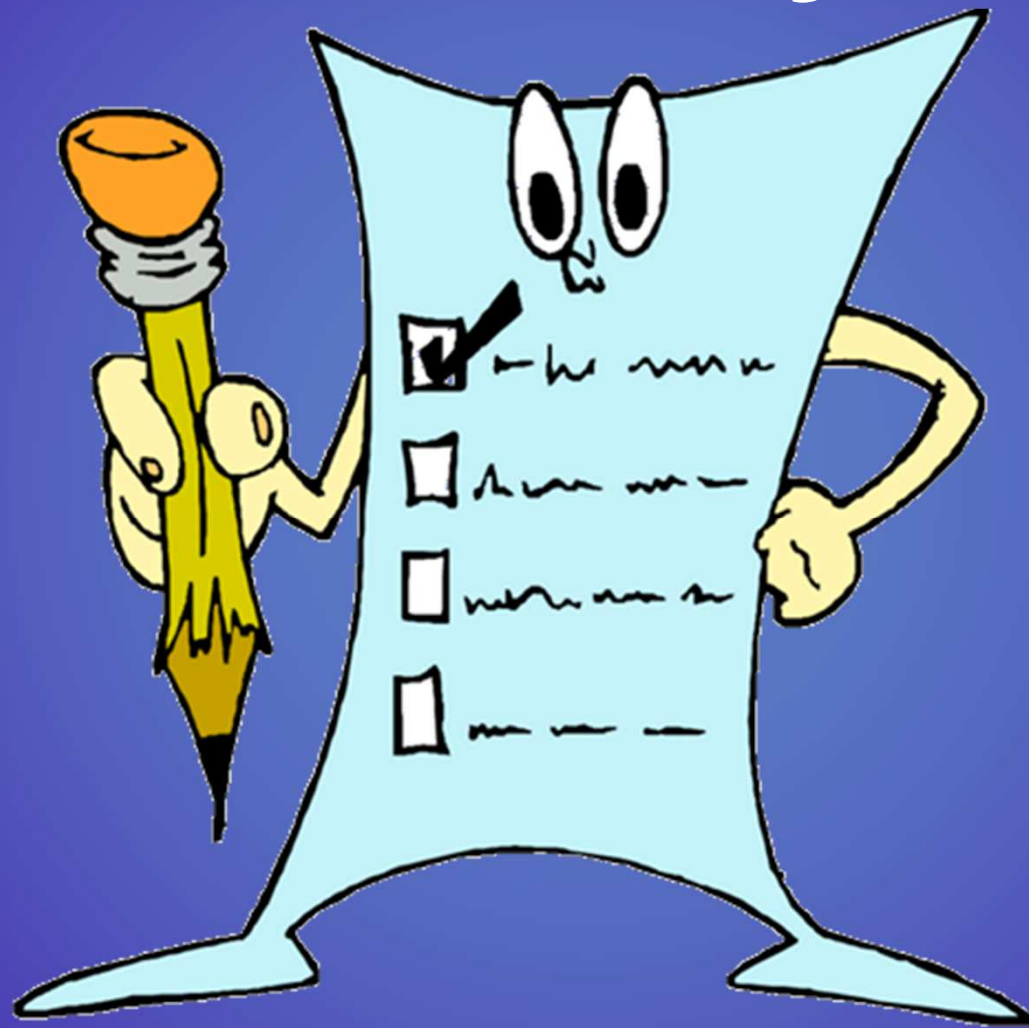
